James | The Duality of the Tongue (James 3:1-12)

Outline

Main Idea: The human tongue's power to bless and curse necessitates mastery; but no human being can tame their tongue

- A. Specific warning and universal fact (1-2)
 - a. Specific warnings: do not desire those privileges if you don't understand the weight of that position; Honor comes with accountability
 - b. If you control what you say, you exercise mastery over the whole body because the tongue exposes the heart
- B. Disproportionate power of the tongue (3-5a)
 - a. Analogies: Bit in the horse of a mouth/ Rutter on a ship
 - b. Tongue: small member of the body has tremendous power
- C. Danger that the tongue is untamable (5b-8)
 - a. The tongue as a fire: one small mistake, example of what our tongues are capable of doing
- D. Duality of the tongue (9-12)
 - a. Blessing and cursing
 - b. Examples without duality- spring and fig tree
 - c. Duality of the tongue found in scripture
 - i. Positive- righteousness, justice, wisdom, praise, kindness, allegiance to God
 - ii. Negative- Deceit, mischief, iniquity, oppression, flattery, boasting, slander, evil, lying, plot destruction
- E. Conclusion- since no human being can tame the tongue, we require a divine intervention to eradicate this sinful condition
 - a. Praise God for his power, mercy and willingness to do it for us
 - b. Isaiah 6:1-7

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Discussion Questions

- 1. James warns those eager to be in leadership that it comes with great accountability, especially when it comes to taming their tongue.
 - a. What are other positions that come with great honor but also great accountability, inside or outside of the church?
 - b. What does it look like to hold one another accountable for the way we speak?
 - c. How do you think the church would change if people took more seriously sin that comes from the way we talk?
- 2. The tongue is a small part that determines the direction of the entire body, and has the same ability as a spark to set fire to an entire forest.
 - a. Why is the tongue so powerful, despite its disproportionate size to the body?
 - b. What are "stains" that you see in the word as a result of evil in people's speech?
 - c. Confession: What are ways you have caused destruction with your own speech?
 - d. Application: How can you bear good fruit with your tongue as seen in scripture? (righteousness, justice, wisdom, praise, gentleness, healing, life, kindness, and allegiance to God)
- 3. If you do not begin with humble acknowledgment of the Lord's holiness compared to the sinful condition of our tongue in a world of destruction, nothing you try to do to tame your tongue will work.
 - a. How have you tried to tame your tongue in the past without asking the Lord to help you?
 - b. Confession: Who are the people that you are prone to loosen your tongue around?
 - c. Application: How can you be actively avoiding the hypocrisy of a dual tongue?
