James | The War Within and Without (James 4:1-10)

Outline

Main Idea: The war exists between people because the war already exists within people.

- 1. The Root of the War (vv. 1-3)
 - a. God offers peace through his wisdom
 - b. Yet, the people are experiencing turmoil and dissension
 - c. This is because of the war within us
 - d. This comes from our desire for pleasure that governs the moments and intents of our hearts.
 - e. Wanting what others have can lead to frustration and anger that you take into other situations.
 - f. Or we don't want to pray for things because we know God wants to change us before he changes our circumcirstance.
 - g. Or we don't receive what we ask for because we are praying out of greed.
- 2. The Product of the War (vv. 4-6)
 - a. We are an adulterous people because we give love that we owe to God to others.
 - b. God is the one perfect husband and thus he is rightly jealous when his people are unfaithful to them.
 - c. But instead of judgment God still grants grace to his unfaithful people.
- 3. How the War is Won (vv. 7-10)
 - a. The only appropriate response to God's goodness is that we humble ourselves before God and submit to Him. Then we receive his grace.
 - b. We must resist the devil by embracing who we are in Christ and standing in our identity in him. This is putting on the armor of God.
 - c. We need to mourn and repent before God.
 - d. Humble yourself before the Lord and he will exalt you.

Discussion Questions

- 1. James begins this passage by explaining what the root of the division and fighting that the church was experiencing was.
 - a. What are the main ways that you are seeing or experiencing turmoil right now? How about inside the church?
 - b. What do you typically think is the root cause of it?
 - c. How does James' teaching in vv. 1-3 provide you with greater insight into what is behind the turmoil and dissension that you are experiencing?
 - d. How have your desires for what others have impacted your relationships with them and others?
 - e. What is something that you have been frustrated about that you haven't been praying for? Why haven't you prayed for it?
 - f. What is an unanswered prayer that you have that might be motivated by selfish desire?
 - g. How then do we approach these desires in God-honoring way?
- 2. James then explains how these desires lead us to be unfaithful to God.
 - a. What do you believe friendship with the world means? How is that being unfaithful to God?
 - b. What happens when people are disloyal or unfaithful to you? How do you respond to them?
 - c. How does the truth that even when God's people are unfaithful to Him he gives them more grace impact you?
- 3. We win this war against our passions and divisions by humbling ourselves before God and submitting to him.
 - a. What does humbling and submitting to God look like, practically speaking?
 - b. In what ways are you being challenged to humble yourself before God right now?
 - c. What does Jesus teach us about how to resist the Devil?
 - d. In what area has the Lord taught you how to resist the Devil and you have enjoyed victory? Where do you need to resist him right now?
 - e. What sin is the Lord teaching you to mourn over right now?
